

## Knowledge and leadership for a sustainable future



### "Impacts" represents a chance for us to review the year, the accomplishments of our students, faculty, and alumni, and our progress toward

OUR Strategic aspirations. Even with the difficulties associated with an entire year marked by the pandemic, our School rose to the challenges, bringing knowledge and leadership to bear on critical issues at local to international scales.

The big news this year is the establishment of a new Yale Center for Natural Carbon Capture, made possible by a major donation from FedEx. This new Center spans Yale and builds on the YSE tradition of solutions-focused science and the substantial expertise in our Forest School. In coming years, it will support two new faculty members for YSE and several doctoral students, and once additional funds are raised, it will enable new path-breaking research in carbon-sequestering plastics, fuels, building materials, and other technological innovations.

Despite global unemployment challenges, our 2021 graduates are successfully landing jobs in environmental fields and entering doctoral programs. They have obtained leadership roles in the non-profit, business, academic, and government sectors across the U.S. and in India, Malaysia, Germany, Singapore, Mexico, Columbia, the Netherlands, China, Myanmar, Rwanda, and Uganda.

With your support, we have successfully advanced our initiative in environmental communications, bringing environmental scholarship to the public and to policy, with Anthony Leiserowitz (Yale Program on Climate Change Communication) just recognized as the second most influential climate scientist in the world — No. 1 in the U.S. — by Reuters. Ideas from our Yale Environmental Dialogue initiative and book, "A Better Planet," and from papers written by Professor Matthew Kotchen are part of the national policy conversation. Our alumni and faculty have led in environmental roles in every U.S. administration in the last 30 years, and this year is no different: at least four alumni and one faculty member have just undertaken key leadership roles in environment and energy offices.

In the coming year, we will be focusing on three key goals: building our urban initiatives, building our environmental data science initiative, and increasing scholarship support for master's students, so that any qualified student who is accepted can feel comfortable matriculating without fear of crippling debt. Stay tuned as we work on achieving these goals, and stay safe!

### New YSE Faculty Bring Wildlife and **Environmental Politics Expertise**


Nyeema Harris, whose groundbreaking research explores carnivore behavior and movement, and Luke Sanford, whose work focuses on the interplay between natural resources and political decisions, have joined the Yale School of the Environment faculty. Harris is an interdisciplinary scholar whose work focuses on ecology and conservation in urban systems and national parks at a global scale with ongoing projects throughout the Americas and Africa. Her position as associate professor of wildlife and land conservation was created with generous support from the Knobloch Family Foundation. She has been awarded a Fulbright to study tiger ecology and conservation in Asia.

Harris's research focuses on the myriad of nature's antagonisms, including parasitism, competition, humanwildlife conflict, and predation. Specifically, she critically

examines spatial and temporal variations in species interactions, how interactive networks are structured, and the ecological consequences of species loss and land-use change.

Sanford's research examines environmental stewardship from a political science perspective. He has created methods for integrating data sources, such as satellite imagery, into causal inference frameworks in his study of environmental politics. An assistant professor of environmental policy and governance, Sanford has designed a simulation in which he will assign YSE students the names of real-life political leaders and environmental advocates to portray when negotiating climate and natural resource policy. One area Sanford will be researching further is the interplay between how countries elect political leaders and the conservation or exploitation of forests and natural resources.

### Leiserowitz No. 2 on Reuters Global Climate Hot List

For over a decade Anthony Leiserowitz, the founder and director of the Yale Program on Climate Change Communication (YPCCC), has been at the forefront of climate perceptions research. This past spring he was recognized by Reuters for his groundbreaking work.

The Reuters "Hot List," which ranks the world's most influential climate scientists, placed Leiserowitz second out of 1,000 (No. 1 in the U.S.). Reuters based the rankings on three criteria: number of research papers published on topics related to climate change; how often those papers are cited by scientists; and how often the work is referenced in the media and policy papers.

Leiserowitz has published over 200 academic articles, chapters, and reports. He is the host of YPCCC's "Climate Connections," a daily radio program broadcast on over 600 stations nationwide. YPCCC's biyearly report, "Climate Change in the American Mind," is regularly cited in major publications.

### YSE Professor Appointed to White House Team

Eli Fenichel, Knobloch Family Professor of Natural Resource Economics at YSE, is on leave serving as assistant director for natural resource economics and accounting in the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP)

Fenichel, an expert on natural capital, studies the interactions between ecological and human systems to develop economic theory related to environmental management. His focus is on how people allocate natural resources and consider natural resource risks through time.

In June, he joined OSTP, which advises the president on the scientific, engineering, and technological aspects of the environment, economy, security, health, and foreign relations.

"The concern over the world's natural resources is growing," Carl W. Knobloch, Jr. Dean Indy Burke said of Fenichel's appointment. "We need experts who understand the complexities involved to inform and develop effective policy."

### Waste Warrior

More than 500,000 people live in public housing units provided and managed by the New York City Public Housing Authority (NYCHA), but NYCHA recycles only 1.5% of its waste. Nationally, that rate is 32%. DeNeile Cooper '22 MEM is working to change that.

As a member of the Manhattan Solid Waste Advisory Board, she established a committee to support recycling efforts at NYCHA.

This past summer, Cooper's committee hosted a community forum highlighting NYCHA's waste management action plan, its sustainability agenda, and its new collaborative pilot project that began July 30 with local grassroots organizations to increase recycling rates and residential involvement.

As part of its efforts, NYCHA is working with the Inner City Green Team to bring recycling to its residents. The team goes door-to-door to collect recycling from residents.

"This work has been successful so far," Cooper says, "because it involves a variety of stakeholders who bring their unique perspectives to create programs that work for everyone." **823** potential master's degree students applied to YSE in 2021, the largest number of student applications in its history

### Spicing up Trail Foods in Sustainable Ways

Tony Cisneros '21 MEM/MBA was hiking in Colorado and feeling pretty uninspired by the food options he had with him. That's when an idea hit him.

And now that idea is ready to reach consumers in the form of Mesa Foods, a company he runs with partner Caroline Ebinger '22 MEM/MBA. The students received YSE's Center for Business and the Environment (CBEY) Climate Innovation Grant and funding from Yale's Tsai Center for Innovative Thinking to help fund the startup.

Mesa promotes an earth-friendly lifestyle selling nutritious, sustainable food products that can be consumed on the go. Its core values are supporting sustainable farmers and food suppliers who are practicing planetary health principles.

"Tony and Caroline are great models for how to think and act in building a business," says Stuart DeCew, CBEY executive director.

### Mapping Positive Change in Panama

Using satellite imagery of farmlands, Cecilia Rogers '22 MFS is mapping the success of YSE's Environmental Leadership Training Initiative (ELTI) program in Panama that helps cattle ranchers incorporate sustainable practices, such as the use of forested pastureland, into their land management.

As a researcher for ELTI, an initiative of The Forest School at YSE that trains people to protect tropical forests globally, Rogers worked with Anna Raffeld '21 MEM, analyzing eight farms over a 10-year period. They found that the amount of sustainably managed land had significantly increased.

In 2011, only 4% of the land on the eight farms was sustainable. By 2020, the amount of sustainable farmland had grown to 66%.

"This is the first data that proves that these land use practices are effective," Rogers says. "It's been very rewarding working on this interdisciplinary project."



### Holding the Line for Sustainable Fishing

Linda Behnken '90 MESc went to Alaska — what she calls the "ultimate wild place" – in 1982, hoping to earn a living using sustainable fishing practices. Since then, she has devoted herself to making sure the livelihoods of independent fishermen are sustained as well.

As Executive Director of the Alaska Longline Fishermen's Association, Behnken, who lives in Sitka, has advocated for state and national policies to protect community-based fisheries and habitats, providing resources locally to promote best fishing practices, and addressing climate change.

Her efforts earned her a Heinz Award in 2020 for her "advocacy work to promote sustainable fishing practices and drive conservation policy while supporting the rural fishing communities of Alaska that rely on the ocean for their livelihood and way of life."

"It's really important to know how your fish was caught when you buy fish in the market," Behnken says. "We want to help people understand there are people fishing in sustainable ways."

### Insights from the Night Sky

When a powerful ice storm hit Texas last winter knocking out much of the state's power grid, Eleanor Stokes '18 PhD was able to help map vulnerable communities through her work as co-leader of Black Marble, NASA's first nighttime light dataset.

Using data from the Visible Infrared Imaging Radiometer Suite aboard NASA's Suomi NPP satellite spacecraft, Stokes was able to pinpoint communities in need of help from FEMA and other relief organizations to inform boots-on-the ground operations.

Her novel use of nighttime light imagery is providing insights on human settlements and the environment.

"Humanity is facing major global risks right now from extreme weather and rising sea levels," she says. "It's very important to have a satellite record that can speak to the human piece of the puzzle."

### Uniting Voices to Safeguard the Planet


Shortly after graduating from YSE, Humna Sharif '21 MEM took on the formidable job of uniting a collective of organizations involved in ocean advocacy.

As government relations manager for the National Ocean Protection Coalition (NOPC), Sharif is working toward three main goals: equitable access to nature, protecting 30% of the oceans by 2030, and safeguarding national marine monuments.

"We all want to help the planet and have healthy oceans, and each organization approaches it differently," says Sharif. "I think the impact comes when we bring together all those voices and present a united front."

Sharif says her generation is bringing an urgency to the issue of climate change.

"I keep reminding people that it's important to hammer ahead and be super ambitious," she says. "We cannot relent."

### Turning Wood into Bioplastics

A year into joining the Center for Industrial Ecology faculty at YSE, Yuan Yao, working with her research team, had a breakthrough in her efforts to take on one of the world's largest polluters: plastic. Yao, assistant professor of industrial ecology and sustainable systems, helped create a high-quality bioplastic from wood.

"We've minimized all of the materials and the waste going into nature," says Yao.

The materials show a high mechanical strength, stability, and UV-light resistance and can be recycled or safely biodegraded in a natural environment with a lower life-cycle environmental impact when compared to petroleum-based plastics and other biodegradable plastics.

Yao is continuing the research with her team and a forest ecologist to create forest simulation models that link the growth cycle of forests with the manufacturing process.

### Engaging Faith Voters on Climate Change

Most American voters of faith not only know that climate change is happening, but they also want their elected officials to support policies that combat it, according to Yale Program on Climate Change Communication (YPCCC) surveys and research. Yet, many alarmed Americans do not always vote.

YPCCC's Partnerships Program is changing that by partnering with Interfaith Power & Light (IPL), a nonprofit that mobilizes people of faith to take bold climate action. One initiative included providing IPL's campaign with technical support, strategic advice, and helping it identify infrequent voters of faith concerned about the climate who received texts. There was a 1.7 percentage point increase in voter turnout due to the IPL texting campaign, with an estimated 1,455 additional people voting.

The efforts are just one example of how YPCCC is helping to expand the climate movement.

### JEDSI Puts Justice and Diversity Front and Center

Dr. Dorceta Taylor '85 MFS, '91 PhD, who was named the School's first Senior Associate Dean of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, has launched the new Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Sustainability Initiative (JEDSI) at YSE.

The initiative examines the relationship among social inequalities, lived experiences, and environmental outcomes. To this end, JEDSI is currently focusing on six primary areas of research, teaching, and practice. It focuses on environmental history; nature and outdoor experiences and attitudes; environmental disparities and inequality; food and farming access and justice; institutional diversity; and building diversity pathway programs.

In April, nearly 900 people from around the world participated in JEDSI's New Horizons in Conservation

Conference, which draws early-career professionals who are historically underrepresented in the environmental field as well as those committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion.

"Environmental racism and discrimination are rampant in the U.S. and around the world," Taylor says. "We hope to inspire a new generation of thinkers and leaders to build sustainable futures for all by identifying and dismantling structures and practices that foster inequities."

Taylor's watershed 2014 study on the state of diversity in nearly 200 U.S. environmental organizations brought into focus the staggering lack of people of color in the field.

## Continuing the momentum


The Yale School of the Environment continues to build on its legacy of knowledge and leadership for a sustainable future and work toward the ambitious goals set out in its 2017 Strategic Plan through its scholarship, teaching, and practice.

### **GOAL:** Develop areas of emerging strength

- Jonas Meckling, of U.C. Berkeley, and A. Scott Denning, of Colorado State University, were appointed as visiting faculty through the Coleman P. Burke Distinguished Visiting Professorship Fund. Meckling, who will serve a year, and Denning, who will serve until December, will teach courses on climate change, provide public lectures, and engage with the climate change science and solutions learning community.
- Launched the Environmental Data Science
  Accelerator Fund with a \$500,000 gift.
  With increased data manipulation and cloud computing capacity, faculty will be able to increase the efficiency of their big data research and the speed at which they are able to reach conclusions, accelerating the uptake of YSE research into policymaking.

## **GOAL:** Build on historic strengths through research, training, programs, and initiatives

- Professor of Plant Physiological Ecology
  Craig Brodersen is leading pioneering research
  to optimize plants' ability to absorb and store
  carbon to fight climate change. The work, in
  collaboration with the Salk Institute's Harnessing
  Plants Initiative, focuses on carbon storage in
  sequestering tissues, drought tolerance, and
  improving photosynthetic performance.
- Yale Center for Environmental Law and Policy (YCELP) helped launched the Zero Carbon Action Plan, which comprehensively lays out a realistic path to nationwide decarbonization. Since its release, the Center has promoted its findings, participated in expert workshops to further refine its recommendations, and conducted briefings for high-ranking policymakers.



### **GOAL:** Create and revise curricula that align with strategic priorities

- Added a new course on data visualization and communication using evidence-based design principles and cutting-edge software tools to develop graphics using diverse datasets.
- Introduced a new course, "Decarbonization Pathways to Limit Climate Change," examining the scale of the climate problem and pathways to achieve net-zero emissions. The course examines the necessary scale of emissions cuts and investigates countries' commitments to strengthen global response.

## **GOAL:** Build and maintain our leadership on issues of national and international importance

- Professor of Tropical Forest Ecology Liza Comita was named co-director of the new Yale Center for Natural Carbon Capture, which was launched with a \$100 million gift from FedEx. The center, which is part of the University's Planetary Solutions project, will develop a portfolio of natural carbon sequestration strategies.
- Knobloch Family Professor of Natural Resource
  Economics Eli Fenichel on leave from the faculty
  at YSE joined the White House Office of Science
  and Technology Policy. Economics Professor
  Matthew Kotchen's research into fossil fuel
  subsidies was cited in the Biden Administration's
  "Made in America Tax Plan" in a section noting
  that tax preferences for oil, gas, and coal
  producers shift energy production away from
  cleaner alternatives.

## **GOAL:** Diversify our faculty, student body, and staff to better address the complex challenges of the future

- Appointed Dr. Dorceta Taylor '85 MFS, '91 PhD as the first Senior Associate Dean of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion to lead the school's DEI efforts. Dr. Thomas Easley, the School's first Assistant Dean of Community and Inclusion, who served through June 2021, helped initiate a pedagogy seminar series on race. The School has increased diversity among students through direct outreach and the creation of hiring guidelines, among other initiatives.
- Created the Center for Environmental Justice under the direction of Environmental Justice Professor Gerald Torres, an acclaimed global scholar of environmental law, critical race theory, and federal Indian law. Torres holds a joint faculty appointment at Yale Law School.

## **GOAL:** Create and support new interdisciplinary scholarship, teaching, and outreach

- Began an interdisciplinary initiative with The Forest School, the Center for Industrial Ecology, and the School of Architecture exploring the carbon benefits of biogenic building materials in urban areas through joint conferences with The Forests Dialogue and Hixon Center for Urban Ecology, new courses, and research.
- Created a new interdisciplinary research initiative within the Environmental Leadership and Training Initiative's Panama landscape as part of a research project supported by the Childs Family Forest Fund. The project examines the ecological results of the model farm network that ELTI established with landholders in Panama's Azuero Peninsula.



## Financial Highlights

FY21 was a record fundraising year, thanks to a landmark \$100M gift from FedEx, of which YSE received \$60M. In looking at the graphs below and opposite, important notes to consider are:

- The entire \$60M from FedEx is restricted to the mission of the Center for Natural Carbon Capture and cannot be repurposed for other needs
- Additionally, the majority of YSE's endowed funds (scholarships, professorships, etc.) are similarly restricted
- Although the School's endowment is managed as part of the greater Yale University endowment, we are a self-supporting school within the University, and in fact, we pay Yale each year for our share of central services such as the library, fire and police protection, etc., through the University Services Assessment (14% of the School's expenses on the chart at right)
